# Packaging

## Plastic, cans and drink packaging



### Plastic, such as:

- ✓ Plastic bags and bread-, pasta-, and candy bags
- ✓ Meat and cheese packaging
- ✓ Plastic film (covering magazines and advertising brochures)
- ✓ Packages for toothbrushes, wires and screws
- ✓ Tubs for butter, sauces, cheese, coffee milk, yoghurt, custard, whipped cream, ice cream
- ✓ Vegetable, fruit and salad trays and sachets/bags, also french fries trays (from cafeteria)
- ✓ Lids from peanut butter and chocolate paste pots
- ✓ Squeeze bottles for sauces like ketchup and mayonnaise
- ✓ Bottles for cleaning-, and laundry detergent
- ✓ Bottles for oil and vinegar
- ✓ Tubes for toothpaste, cream, lotions and other care products
- ✓ Bottles for soft drinks, water and dairy produce
- ✓ Pots for hair gel, medication and vitamins
- ✓ Plastic plant pots (small)
- ✓ Fruit net (e.g. tangerines, oranges, lemons)

### Cans, such as:

- ✓ Aluminum foil
- ✓ Food cans (e.g. soup, meat and vegetables)
- ✓ Cans from soft drinks and beer
- ✓ Dog and cat food cans
- ✓ Lemonade syrup cans and bottles
- ✓ Lids from pots, screw caps and beer caps
- ✓ Packaging including aluminum foil, e.g. for chips and coffee or similar packaging like candy bars (Twix/Mars)
- ✓ Tealight cups



### Drink packaging, such as:

- ✓ For juice, softdrinks and wine
- ✓ For dairy products, like milk, yoghurt and custard

### Did you know...

- ⚠ You don't have to clean or rinse the empty packages?
- ⚠ Caps or lids do not need to be removed?
- ⚠ Is it reusable? Then it is not recyclable
- ⚠ Plastic toys and plastic garden chairs are still not allowed.

# Fruit, vegetable and garden waste



## Food leftovers, garden waste and expired products

### Food waste, such as:

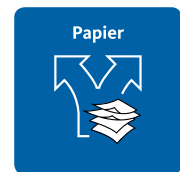
- ✓ Vegetable and fruit scraps and peels
- ✓ Food scraps/leftovers (also fish and meat bones)
- ✓ Bread, dough, pasta en rice
- ✓ Eggshells
- ✓ Peanut and nutshells
- ✓ Loose tea leaves and coffee ground (not the teabag or coffee pad)

### Garden waste, such as:

- ✓ Litter (e.g. hay, straw, or sawdust) from small rodents (small animals) with their stool/poo
- ✓ Flowers and plants
- ✓ Fine garden waste (weeds, mowed grass, leaves)



# Paper



## Clean paper, magazines, paper packaging

### Clean and dry, such as:

- ✓ Newspapers, leaflets (without the plastic cover)
- ✓ Printed paper, fax-, copy-, writing- and drawing paper
- ✓ Telephone books (directories)
- ✓ Envelopes
- ✓ Gift (wrapping) paper
- ✓ Paper bags
- ✓ Cardboard boxes
- ✓ All cardboard and paper packaging
- ✓ Egg boxes
- ✓ Paper napkins
- ✓ Kitchen paper (except with oil residues)



### Don'ts:

- ✗ Wet and dirty, such as coffee filters, wet wipes, diapers
- ✗ Containing plastic or other materials, such as: wallpaper, binders, bubble wrap envelopes, or plasticized packaging

### Did you know...

- ⚠ Newspapers are made from recycled household paper?
- ⚠ Sanitary paper is made from office paper?
- ⚠ New cardboard is made from recyclable cardboard?
- ⚠ Paper can be reused 6 to 7 times?

# Textiles

Clean clothing, shoes, socks, belts, gloves, towels

- ✓ Cleaning cloths
- ✓ Worn clothes and swim clothing
- ✓ Socks
- ✓ Shoes
- ✓ Belts, bags, ties, hats, caps and gloves
- ✓ Stuffed animals
- ✓ Curtains
- ✓ Bed linen: sheets, blankets, duvet covers
- ✓ Bath towels, tea towels, table cloth, napkins, washcloth

## Did you know...

- ⚠ Re-wearable textiles are resold in thrift stores?
- ⚠ The fibers for new textile are made from old and worn-out clothing
- ⚠ Old and used textile is used to make insulation material?

# Glass

Coloured glass, clear glass

## For packaging (with cap or lid):

- ✓ Beverage bottles such as wine and fruit juice bottles
- ✓ Food containers e.g. pasta sauce or vegetables
- ✓ Small bottles containing cosmetics
- ✓ Any other sort of packaging for glass

## Did you know...

- ⚠ Useful household goods like vases, glassware, or ceramic can be brought to the thrift store.
- ⚠ All the glass with the 'glasbak' – logo is allowed in the glass container?
- ⚠ All glass with lid/cap, and scraps is allowed in the glass container?
- ⚠ At some locations glass is sorted by colour? (clear or coloured glass). This is indicated on the glass container.

# Non-recyclable waste

Have you sorted all of your garbage?

Non-recyclable waste is part of household waste that is left over after you have sorted and disposed of everything that can be reused.
